Fall Is Here

Fall is not just cooler weather and pretty leaves; it is also the prime time to plant more trees. David Richert is the Chairperson for the Town of Wytheville's Tree Advisory Committee, and he shares three beneficial reason to consider planting in the Fall. First is temperature: cooler temperatures combined with shorter, brighter days during the fall months create an ideal environment for newly planted trees. Extreme environmental factors, such as



high temperatures, can compound a new tree's stress level making it more difficult for it to properly establish. Second is fewer pests and diseases: threats from pests and diseases are often lower during the fall season. For example, leaf defoliating insects are more common during the spring and summer months but begin to recede as the temperature starts to decline. Fewer

pest and diseases mean less stress on newly planted trees. Third is new root growth: new trees begin establishing their new root system immediately after planting in the fall. Following the hot summer months, the soil remains warm well into the fall season, creating a new root environment for new root growth. In addition, the cooler

As the fall season sets in, temperatures drop, and the sun sets earlier each day. While we are all busy enjoying the weather, it is



important to remember that this time of year is perfect cover for petty criminals. Here are a few simple tips that will help you from becoming a victim of theft. Put on those lights, criminals do not like bright lights. A carefully placed floodlight on a motion sensor is an economical way to prevent people from lurking in the shadows. Lock those doors! Most vehicle thefts are spontaneous events. If a thief is confronted with a locked door, it is likely that they will move on to next car. Keep your valuables in the house. Lock your car!!! Don't be afraid to call the police if there is something abnormal in your neighborhood. If you see suspicious activities, don't hesitate to call 911.

temperatures, and shorter days trigger trees to send resources to their roots in preparation for the winter which furthers root development. A tree's roots will continue to grow until the ground freezes in the fall, resulting in a stronger, more developed root system ready to "spring" into action when leaves emerge in April /May.

I would also like to introduce you once again to the Town of Wytheville Specimen Tree Program that was adopted by the Tree Advisory Committee to recognize trees with significance to Wytheville and the surrounding area. The Specimen Tree Program should help citizens engage, notice, appreciate and be inspired by trees throughout the Town and surrounding area. The Tree Advisory Committee is working hard to obtain citizens' participation by taking a few minutes to submit their special tree. Nomination forms for the Specimen Tree Program are available on the Town's OpenGov site located at *https:/wythevilleva.viewpointcloud.com*. October is Fire Prevention Month. During this month and every six months, it is recommended that smoke detector testing and battery replacement be conducted. Maintenance and testing are vital to ensure that maximum safety measures are being utilized. All detectors have a life span. When changing their batteries, check to make sure the detector is within 10 years of the manufacturer's recommendations. Did you know that the Wythe Bland Animal Welfare League (WBAWL), is a partner with the Town of Wytheville's Cat Shelter? WBAWL helps with supplies and some Vet care, the volunteer program is growing, and you do not need to be a member of WBAWL to volunteer. They still need help with transports or spending time with the kittens/cats to get them socialized for adoptions and rescues. Council Actions

September 12, 2022:

- Upon recommendation from the Budget and Finance Committee, Council approved amending the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget to appropriate \$10,500 to account number 011010-5682 to restore the Main Street Program to full staffing level.
- Scheduled a public hearing for the Oct 10, 2022, Town Council Meeting to consider the request of Kenneth and Jennifer Peeples for a Special Exemption Permit to use property located on the north side of North Street between Tremough Drive and Fairfield Lane, Tax Parcel 24A-1-49, as pasture for four horses, in a R-3 residential zone.

September 26, 2022:

- Reappointed Mr. Jeffrey Lucas to the Wytheville Economic Development Authority for a four-year term (expires December 12, 2026).
- Appointed Ms. Lisa Anderson to the Wytheville Redevelopment and Housing Authority for a fouryear term (expires September 8, 2026).
- Adopted a resolution supporting the issuance of a revenue bond by the New River Regional Water Authority and acknowledging certain matters with respect to the bond, including a moral obligation to make certain appropriations in support of the Authority.
- Adopted an amended resolution waiving the Peddler's License fee for food truck operators participating in events sponsored by the Town of Wytheville, Downtown Wytheville, Incorporated, Wythe County Joint Industrial Development Authority or Wytheville-Wythe-Bland Chamber of Commerce until December 31, 2023.
