How Do I Report a Problem After Hours?

From time to time, situations occur that necessitate citizens to call the Town of Wytheville after normal business hours. Below is information that will be helpful if that need arises.

If your problem requires Police, Fire or Rescue, call 911.

Otherwise, dial **276-223-3333** or **276-223-3300** and you will be connected to an automated attendant that will direct you to the appropriate department.

You will be given the following options:

- For Water and sewer problems, press 1
- To report a signal light problem, press 2
- To report a street blockage such as a downed tree, press 3
- If you are calling about an animal control problem, press 4
- If you are calling regarding a parking ticket or police report, or to speak to a Duty Sergeant, press 5



Town of Wytheville Still Has Vehicle Decals

It will soon be time to purchase your 2017 Town of Wytheville vehicle decals. This year's decal showcases the branding theme used to market Wytheville to travelers who visit our area—Wytheville...There's Only One.

Beginning March 1, decals will be available for automobiles and motorcycles. All personal property and mobile home taxes for the Town of Wytheville and Wythe County must be paid before a decal will be issued. Automobile decals cost \$20.00; motorcycle decals are \$6.00. Your Social Security number and vehicle registration will be required when purchasing the decal. All decals must be purchased and displayed by April 15, 2017, to avoid violation. All vehicles owned by citizens of the Town of Wytheville must display a current decal. Decals can be purchased in the Treasurer's Office located within the Municipal Building at 150 East Monroe Street. Call 223-3333 for more information.
