News from the Wytheville Police Department

The Wytheville Police Department has received complaints regarding vehicles passing on the right, and going across parking spaces that are vacant to go around a vehicle that is turning left on Main Street and other streets. According to the Code of Virginia 46.2-841, passing on the right is allowed when a vehicle is making a left-hand turn and the spaces are not occupied by parked vehicles. That being said, in the event that a pedestrian or other vehicle is struck, then the Police and the law will become involved. We have seen a couple of car wrecks and, thank goodness, no pedestrians have been hit! **WE DO NOT WANT ANY INJURIES, ESPECIALLY ANY PEDESTRIANS!** Our Police Department wants to caution drivers from passing on the right. Let's be safe drivers.

Council Actions

September 11, 2023:

- Approved reinstating the Façade Program.
- Approved the request of the Wytheville Police Department and the Wytheville Fire and Rescue Department to close
 a portion of Spring and Church Streets on October 31, 2023, from 4:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. for the Church Street Trunk or
 Treat Event.
- Approved the request of Downtown Wytheville Incorporated to close Main Street from 5th Street to 4th Street and a
 portion of Church, Tazewell, and First Streets, on Saturday, October 28, 2023, from 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. for the 2023
 Mayhem on Main Street event.
- Appointed Ms. Eden N. Miller as a youth member to the Wytheville Recreation Commission (term expires August 1, 2024).
- Scheduled a Special Town Council meeting on October 11, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. and scheduled a public hearing for this meeting to consider a bond in the maximum amount of \$843,000 to be used to acquire a refuse truck and a dehumidification unit for the Town.
- Approved the Policy Guidance on Event Safety, Street Closures and Traffic Control, as amended.

NOTICE TO CONSUMERS of the Town of Wytheville Waterworks Waterworks ID No. 1197810

We have been advised by State Health Officials that the water supplied by this waterworks during the twelve-month monitoring period from October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2023, exceeded the four quarter Primary Maximum Contaminant Level locational running annual average of 0.060 milligrams per liter (mg/l) for Haloacetic Acid (HAA5) contained in the Commonwealth of Virginia/ State Board of Health *Waterworks Regulations*. The four-quarter running annual average HAA5 concentration is 0.066 mg/l.

Disinfection of public drinking water is necessary to prevent waterborne diseases such as typhoid and cholera. However, the disinfectants themselves can react with naturally occurring material in the source water to form unintended byproducts which may pose a health risk. Haloacetic Acid (HAA5) are known byproducts of the drinking water disinfection process that have a primary maximum contaminant level(s) and this waterworks is required to monitor the distribution system on a quarterly basis.

Some people who drink water containing haloacetic acids in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

We will continue to collect Haloacetic Acid (HAA5) samples every three months to determine compliance with the *Waterworks Regulations*.

This is not an immediate risk to consumers. If there had been an immediate risk, you would have been advised accordingly. No consumer action is necessary at this time.
